## PHONICS SCREENING CHECK in YEAR ONE

The phonics screening check is used to help schools determine Year 1 pupils' phonics skills. Teachers administer the



check one-on-one with each pupil and record whether their response to each of the 40 words is correct. Each pupil is awarded a mark between 0 and 40 and these are reported to parents in the end of year reports issued in July. If a pupil does not meet the expected standard at the end of Year 1, a programme of support will be put in place and their teacher will administer a re-take in Year 2.

#### **SAFEGUARDING**

Children and young people use many different social media apps and sites. The most popular are Facebook and Instagram, with many others such as Snapchat, TikTok and Twitter. There are lots of benefits to social

networking. Children can stay connected to friends and family. They



can also learn many different things, from make-up or gaming tutorials to making slime, or how to create their own videos. Like most things, there can be negatives too. For children and young people there are risks that you should be aware of, to help keep your child safe on social media.

Each app your child may use will have an age rating and it's useful to know what these are. Many have a minimum age of 13 years, but you should check the age rating of individual apps to make sure.
