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YEAR ONE

Key Question:	Where is the Wanderer going?
Key Text for Linked Learning:	The Wanderer – Peter Van Den Ende
Key Vocabulary:	Expectations, routine, feelings, emotions, regulate, red zone,
	blue zone, green zone, yellow zone, wanderer

Linked Learning: English

This week is all about 'the Wanderer'. Children will begin the week, exploring what a 'Wanderer is' by using some of the pages of this picture book to come up with some tales about what and where the Wanderer might be going. The children will be writing some dictated sentence based of some of the imagery from the key text. This will support with revisiting the features of a sentence from Reception; capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and remembering their letter formations too.

Phonics:

This week the children will be revisiting the 'grow the code' for the following graphemes: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, oi, ur, er, ear, air. Can the children spot these on the 'grow the code', form them correctly and spot them within words by sound buttoning...?

The children will be revisiting and reviewing tricky words: Phase 2, 3 and some Phase 4.

Reading:

To apply their phonics knowledge in their daily reading practise session. This will consist of revisiting grapheme cards, decodable words, tricky words, and vocabulary. Each session, the children will be developing their decoding, prosody, and comprehension skills. By the end of the week, children will be reading their books with fluency.

Maths:

The children will explore how 5 can be composed of two parts and practise recalling bonds of 5. They will de-compose 5 and use their subitising skills to identify the parts within 5 using a range of representations.

Science:

The children will be introduced to our topic for this half term of 'what is an animal?'. This week, the children will be seeing if they can identify the animal being described.

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History:

Computing:

Key Text for Linked Learning:	The Wanderer by Peter Van Den Ende	



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Key Vocabulary:

Wanderer, collectors, explorers, descriptive, fresh eyes, curiosity, traditional, alive, dead, habitat.

Linked Learning:

This week in English, the children will explore the text The Wanderer. This particular text is a picture book which the children will need to use their background knowledge and inference skills to understand the images and make their own predictions and to infer what the story is about. Finally, they will explore an image using a range of descriptive vocabulary to write their own description of what could be happening.

Maths:

This week in Maths, the children will be revisiting basic skills of using a ruler correctly and forming their numbers whilst having the highest expectations for their presentation.

Science:

This week in science, the children will be studying biology, Living Things and their Habitats. They will find out the difference between things that are dead and those that are alive. Discovering how living things depend on each other. They will then use this knowledge to create a piece of work to be displayed in the classroom

History:

History this week, the children will begin their topic all about The Great Fire of London. They will be discussing where and when the fire started and encouraged to imagine what life would've looked like in London 1666.

Linked Learning:

Linked Learning: This week in English, the children will explore the text, The Wanderer, by Peter Van Den Ende. This picture book encourages children to use their background knowledge and inference skills to understand the images, make predictions, and infer the story's meaning. The children will then immerse themselves in each image, using a mix of vivid descriptions to imagine and write about what might be happening in the scene.		
Maths: This week in Maths, the children will be revisiting basic skills of using a ruler correctly, forming their numbers accurately whilst having the highest expectations for their presentation.		
Science: The children will begin this week's science lesson by identifying what they know and what they would like to find out about states of matter. They will then discuss and explore the properties that make a material, solid or a liquid.		
History: In History this week the children will be discussing where and when the first civilisations began.		
Geography: No Geography due to ATLP training day.		
French:This week in French, the children will be re-calling how to say hello and tell someone their name before discussing the different answers to 'How are you?' using 'Ca-va' as their starting point.Computing:

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YEAR FIVE

Key Questions:	Who is the Wanderer?
Key Text for Linked Learning:	The Wanderer by Peter van den Ende
Key Vocabulary:	unique, ferocious, generation, perspective, terrestrial, solar,
	system, authentic, audaciously, buoyant

English:

In English, children will begin the week with a slow reveal of the book cover for "The Wanderer." Children will make predictions about the story based on the cover illustration, sparking curiosity and discussion. We'll start exploring the narrative through the detailed illustrations, allowing children to infer and interpret the story visually. Then the children will dive deeper into the book's illustrations, discussing what each image depicts and how it contributes to the overall narrative. This will help them understand the story's progression and themes without text. Next, we will explore expanded noun phrases. We'll examine how detailed descriptions enhance storytelling by looking at examples from the book's illustrations. The children will then practice creating their own expanded noun phrases, using the illustrations and their imaginary journeys as inspiration. After that, we will select specific illustrations from the book and discuss the setting in detail. The children will note down descriptive words and expanded noun phrases that effectively capture the essence of these settings. By the end of the week, the children will use their notes and expanded noun phrases to write a detailed setting description of an illustration from "The Wanderer." This will be an opportunity to apply their learning and creativity, bringing the scene to life through their writing.

Maths:

This week, children will explore the place value of each digit in 5-digit numbers. Children will practice reading and writing 5-digit numbers, explore how a number changes when they add or subtract 1s, 10s, 100s, 1000s, 1000s and apply this understanding to solve problems. They then place 5-digit numbers on a number line and compare them. Towards the end of the week children will work on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000 using a number line and find the nearest multiples of 10, 100 or 1000 to a 5-digit number, in a problem-solving investigation.

Science:

In Science, the children will be exploring habitats and understanding the ecosystem's diversity below the ocean.



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History: No History due to ATLP training day.

Geography:

In Geography, the children will chart their own imaginary journey around the world as if they were the wanderer. They will map out key destinations and adventures they envision encountering, integrating geographical knowledge with creative thinking.

Computing: No Computing due to ATLP training day.

Music: No Music due to ATLP training day.

Art:

In Art, the children will be in groups of four. The children will each receive a quarter of an illustration from the book to recreate. Once each student has completed their quarter, the group will combine their pieces to form the whole image. This collaborative project will not only enhance their understanding of the illustrations but also foster teamwork and attention to detail.

PDW: This week in PDW, the children will be sharing what they have done over the holidays and taking part in getting to know your teachers challenge alongside a re-introduction to The Zones of Regulation Curriculum.

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YEAR SIX

Key Question:	Can I create a fantastical beast?
Key Text for Linked Learning:	The Wanderer – Peter van der Ende
Key Vocabulary:	Marine, realm, nautical, sumptuous, other-worldly, trawlers,
	hulking, aquatic, ominous, noxious

Linked Learning:

This week, Year 6 will be exploring the wordless key text 'How to be a Lion' by Ed Vere. They will identify and discuss themes and conventions in the story and make inference to any underlying messages or ideas the author may convey. They will follow the journey through realms unimagined, or perhaps reimagined but as a mirror to our own. Its nautical narrative will allow them to explore to a tale which invites them to reconsider their place on this blue planet and, subtly, their impact upon it. They will glimpse into its wondrously alien, watery realm that flourishes beneath the ocean's skin, and create new characters and a setting description for it. They will use the text as a stimulus to write their own narrative. In which they will recap key knowledge from previous years to create a piece that is structured coherently and engaging for the reader – creating characters and settings that are brought to life through rich and detailed descriptions. Once their first draft is completed, they will propose changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance effects and clarify meaning – with the additional challenge of showing their understanding of figurative devices taught throughout KS2. After the piece has been edited and improved, they will publish their narratives: showing their ability to use clear and consistent handwriting and organisational structures to guide the reader.

Maths:

The children will revisit their understanding of place value. They will solve number and practical problems involving place value; add/subtract powers of 10; solve number and practical problems involving place value.

Science:

In Science, children will build on previous knowledge of water surface tension to create experiments inspired by the boat in 'The Wanderer'. The children will recall their prior knowledge of forces to investigate the best shape in which to create their own 'wandering' boat. Using their prior knowledge of states of matter, they will explore how to make their boat travel through water quickly.

Art:

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In Art, the children will be inspired by the monochrome ink art in 'The Wanderer' and will be creating illustrations of their own to accompany their monster creation and a seascape.

PDW:

Whilst considering the little boat in 'The Wanderer', the children will discuss the realities of change and new situations. They will explore their feelings towards change and coping methods for new challenges.
