

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ATTENDANCE

If your child has been absent from school this academic year you will know that our teaching staff are calling home to share their best wishes for a speedy recovery. If



you have been in receipt of one of these calls I hope you found the opportunity to speak with your child's class teacher useful. Attendance is important but we understand that occasionally children become unwell.

Currently our whole school attendance is 97.7%.

94% of our pupils have an attendance rate above the persistently absent threshold of 90%.

SAFEGUARDING

"Safeguarding is everybody's responsibility".

Now that your child is back in school and using their ipad regularly you will want to enusre that they use it safely and appropriately when at home. This will be espeically important if your child is in Year One.

The start of the academic year is a good time to agree some healthy rules and boundaries inlcuding when they can use their device and the apps you are happy for them to access. Check-in with your child about their device use. It doesn't have to



be a big sit-down conversation. Informal chats over the dinner table, in the car or while watching television as a family can have the biggest impact. Ask questions like, "Tell me about your favourite app! Why do you like to use it?" or, "How has your device helped you today?"On-line safety is never a one-off conversaton—it will be a continuing dialogue, right the way through into secondary school.
