SAFEGUARDING / FIREWORK SAFETY

Fireworks are loud, spectacular, beautiful and exciting but as we all know, when celebrating with fireworks, firework safety must always take priority over everything else. There are many hazards and common causes of injury in the UK associated with fireworks, we have listed below a guide to sparklers, bonfires, and the firework code.

- 1. Adults should only buy fireworks over the counter from respected stores.
- 2. Only an adult should handle and light fireworks.
- 3. Fireworks should be kept in a closed box away from sparks.
- 4. An adult should read and follow the instructions for lighting fireworks carefully.
- 5. Fireworks are lit at arm's length.
- 6. Always stand well back (8m is best).
- 7. Never go back to a lit firework.
- 8. Never put fireworks in your pocket.
- 9. **NEVER THROW FIREWORKS**





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ATTENDANCE
