#### ABERDOVEY RESIDENTIAL VISIT




Children in upper Key Stage Two will be off on their adventures to the picturesque fishing village of Aberdovey on Monday 2nd December.

#### YEAR 4 OPEN MORNINGS



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#### **ATTENDANCE**

At this time of year, it can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell.



#### **Impetigo**

If your child has impetigo, they'll need treatment from a pharmacist or GP, often with antibiotics.

Keep them off school until all the sores have crusted over and healed, or for 48 hours after they start antibiotic treatment.

#### Measles

If your child has measles, they'll need to see a GP. Call the GP surgery before you go in, as measles can spread to others easily. Keep your child off school for at least 4 days from when the rash first appears. They should also avoid close contact with babies and anyone who is pregnant or has a weakened immune system.

#### Ringworm

If your child has ringworm, see your pharmacist unless it's on their scalp, in which case you should see a GP. It's fine for your child to go to school once they have started treatment.

#### **Scarlet fever**

If your child has scarlet fever, they'll need treatment with antibiotics from a GP. Otherwise they'll be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks. Your child can go back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.

### **SAFEGUARDING**

# Winter Water Safety

In winter, children and pets are particularly at risk when tempted to play on the ice formed on open water,



and adults can find themselves at risk in attempting to save them.

**KEEP BACK FROM THE EDGE** Keep back from slippery banks. Stick to well-lit areas and plan your walks in daylight or along well-lit paths. Never go onto the ice.

### **KEEP CHILDREN AND DOGS WITHIN**

**REACH** Teach children not to go onto ice. Keep dogs on a lead near ice and slippery banks. If out enjoying a winter walk, walk with friends.

**IF YOU'RE IN TROUBLE FLOAT AND CALL FOR HELP.** Stay calm, float on your back and call for help.

CALL 999 Do not enter cold water or ice to rescue.

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




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
