Next Week at Hill West

Key Question: Will Arthur deliver the forgotten present on time?

Key Text for Linked Learning: Arthur Christmas **Linked Learning:** Science, Computing and Science

The children will begin this week by creating story maps, which will tell the journey that Arthur and Grandad took as they deliver a forgotten present. This will then lead them to rewrite their own narrative of the story providing them with the opportunity to incorporate all of the fantastic English skills they have learned. Children will also be introduced to paragraphs this week. After completing their story, they will evaluate their own work and identify areas that require up-levelling and editing. In science this week, the children research creatures in larger habitats and ask: why do these living things live there? They will then create dioramas of different habitats and label with research information about how animals have adapted over time.

Maths: Venn diagrams, Carroll diagrams, tally charts, block graphs and pictograms

Science: see above

Geography: This week in geography the children will be developing their knowledge of the oceans and continents of the world investigating the proportion of land to ocean on Earth understand the differences between oceans and seas.

Computing: This week the children will begin to create the story 'Arthur Christmas' on scratch. They will draw their own background using paint and create their own sprite (Elf) which they will begin to move. They will track Santa's journey across the globe.

Music: This week the children will be practising the songs for the class nativity and Christingle songs

Art: This week the children will look at the work of Jackson Pollock. They will choice Christmas colour to create a back ground splatter painting for their colanders.

Design Technology: The children will be exploring a variety of methods to join a variety of materials without using adhesive and investigating which methods are the strongest, to make the cards, calendars and Christmas decorations.

PDW / R.E: In R.E. children will be learning all about Christmas and why it is an important religious event.

PE: Quick cricket: Children will continue to build on their skills of the preceding weeks and refining their fielding and bating techniques in a games situation
