Key Question Week 11: Who has crash landed at Hill West?

Key Text for Linked Learning: Aliens love underpants

What has happened in our playground? Has a spaceship landed? Who could it be? Dr Clarke spotted something running across the playground it had 3 eyes, was bright blue with yellow furry stripes. What might it be? After heading to the moon last week, we will be back down on planet Earth but somebody has followed us! The children will be helping our new little friends to get home this week by building them a new spaceship. They will be learning about planet Earth to share with our new little space aliens. The children will read clues about the alien's planet. Can they guess what planet it is?

PSED:

There will be many opportunities where the children will be working together to create Alien related imaginative things this week. They will be encouraged to listen to the ideas from their peers and take turns.

Communication and Language:

Children will become mini detectives to find out what has happened at school. They will listen and respond to ideas expressed by others in discussion.

Physical Development: In Physical Development this week, the children will continue developing their kicking skills. They will be working on kicking a ball with increasing control to a friend. We will focusing on their handwriting this week. The children will be working on ensuring they are forming some letters correctly.

Literacy:

In phonics this week, the children they will be consolidating our knowledge on the phase 3 phoneme. They will be applying it in their reading and writing of phase 3 word e.g. moon, flower, rain. The children will also be encouraged to write sentence including the phase 3 tricky words.

In writing, they will be applying their writing skills in a variety of ways from writing 'missing' posters, descriptions and facts about what has happened.

Mathematics: In Number, the children will be learning about the numeral 15. The numberblock 15 will be introduced to them and they will be representing 15 in different ways e.g numicon, cubes, fingers, tens frame (same value, different appearance). They will be looking at what numbers make 15 and how the numeral 15 looks. We will be consolidating 'one more' and further devleoping 'one less'. Children will be encouraged to find 'one less' than a given number; practically, using recorded methods and mentally.

In Shape, Space and Measure, the children will be learning the days of the week and months of the year through chants and songs. Can they think of what month their Birthday or a different event or favourite time of year is in?

Understanding of the World:

As part of their understanding of the world area of learning, the children will continue to learn simple facts about the planets. They will using a simple program on the laptops to design a new planet for the aliens to return to.

Expressive Arts and Design:

In small groups, the children will be building a new spaceship from junk modelling to help our visiting alien return to their home planet.

Vocabulary:

The children will be exposed to this vocabulary this week. They will learn the meaning of these words too.




