## Top Marks - Division

**Key Question Week 12:** How do we change as we get older?

**Key Text for Linked Learning:** Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo

**Linked Learning:** English, PDW

In English, the children will continue to read the story of Kensuke's Kingdom. They will analyse key events that occur in the early chapters and consider the motivation of different characters. The children will utilise their knowledge of figurative language such as similes, metaphors and personification. The children will be writing an alternative ending to the story in the style of Michael Morpurgo, they will be sure to include the classic descriptive approach which Morpurgo uses and a high frequency of cohesive devices to move the story along such as: Conjunctions, repetition and Fronted adverbials. In PDW children will discuss some of the physical and emotional changes which occur during puberty, including the menstrual cycle and they will understand the implications for emotional and physical health (with a member of the Leadership Team).

**Maths:** Children will be applying their knowledge of decimals and comparing them to fractions and converting each into percentages. Children will learn how to accurately identify the percentage of an amount and relate this to real-world percentage problems.

**Science:** Children will explain how gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect (e.g. investigating the effect of these on movement in simple machines), children will be looking at controlling variables where necessary in order to accurately experiment.

**History:** This week, children will be re-enacting the Battle of Hastings, through a series of still-motion shots, between the Ango-Saxons and the Vikings. Children will be using a range of sources in order to identify the key moment, principally the Bayeux Tapestry.

**R.E:** This week, children will look at what happens at the end of the Lent period, using the bible to find out about Jesus' crucifixion. **PDW**: (See Above.) Children will also learn about how to maintain relationships online with their peers, including appropriate online conduct and how to report and diminish the prevalence of online abuse.

**P.E:** This week, children will apply their tactical knowledge to a game situation, taking part in a mini tournament in Rugby which will test physical and their team-working skills. Children will also be using the appropriate skill to beat an opponent.

**MFL:** Children will take part in a mini-comprehension quiz to test their understanding of the French they have learned this half-term. (The numbers to 30, different foods, likes and dislikes).


