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Key Question Week 6: What are the bare necessities of life?

Key Text for Linked Learning: Jungle Book

Linked Learning: English, Music, Computing,

This week the children will continue their exploration of the artist Henri Rousseau. Children will be manipulating the artist's picture, Tiger in a Tropical Storm, using an iPad to either add or change the image. As well as this, the children will be using tracing paper to trace the image, then deciding which medium they would like to use to recreate the drawing. In English, children will be adapting the story, 'Jungle Book'. The children will plan changes to parts of the story; main character, setting, animals and plot. All children, by the end of the week will have written their own Jungle Book story. In Phonics, the children will be consolidating Phases 3, 4 and 5 sounds through many different activities, such as - phoneme hunts, sound buttoning, using ipads to record spoken sounds and playing many games e.g. trash and treasure.

Maths: This week children will continue to secure their addition and subtraction skills on number bonds to ten. Children will then use their number bonds of 10 to subtract by bridging ten (Eg 15-8 = Move 5 spaces to 10 first before then moving a further 3 to get to the final answer). Towards the end of the week, children will be sorting calculations in accordance to whether they will bridge 10 or not.

Science: Children will use scientific vocabulary to label diagrams of fruit (flower): stem, petal, seeds, roots, leaves, flower. They will use their prior knowledge of labelling a flower to support with this.

Geography: Children will use subject specific vocabulary to describe different types of weather in the U.K including storms, rain, snow, sunny days, heat waves. They will use their knowledge to help them give a weather report on what they have seen (weather types) over the weekend.

History: Children will continue learning about the Wright Brothers and 'Aeroplanes'; What they have done? When they did it?

Computing: See above

Music: Children will be listening and appraising the song, 'Daydream Believer' by The Monkees. They will be comparing this song to the other songs they have learnt this half term and will be deciding which one is their favourite. The children will also create their own listening map; a visual representation of any feelings, words, pictures or colours they might see/feel whilst listening to the song.

Art / Design Technology: Children will complete their Rousseau inspired work by manipulating the image using tracing paper and an ipad.

PDW / R.E: Children will begin to discuss and understand the difference between a secret and a surprise; meaning of them and what to do if they are told to keep something secret.

P.E: Children will be working towards playing a range of invasion games; This week the children will work in small groups of 6 and we will be teaching them how to defend a ball using body movement and marking a player. This will be developed further through games of 'bench ball' style game.

We can find 13 - 8 in two steps, using our knowledge that 8 is 3 + 5:

13 - 3 = 10, then 10 - 5 = 5. So, 13 - 8 = 5


Using this image, get some tracing paper or greasy proof paper – can you manipulate it?
