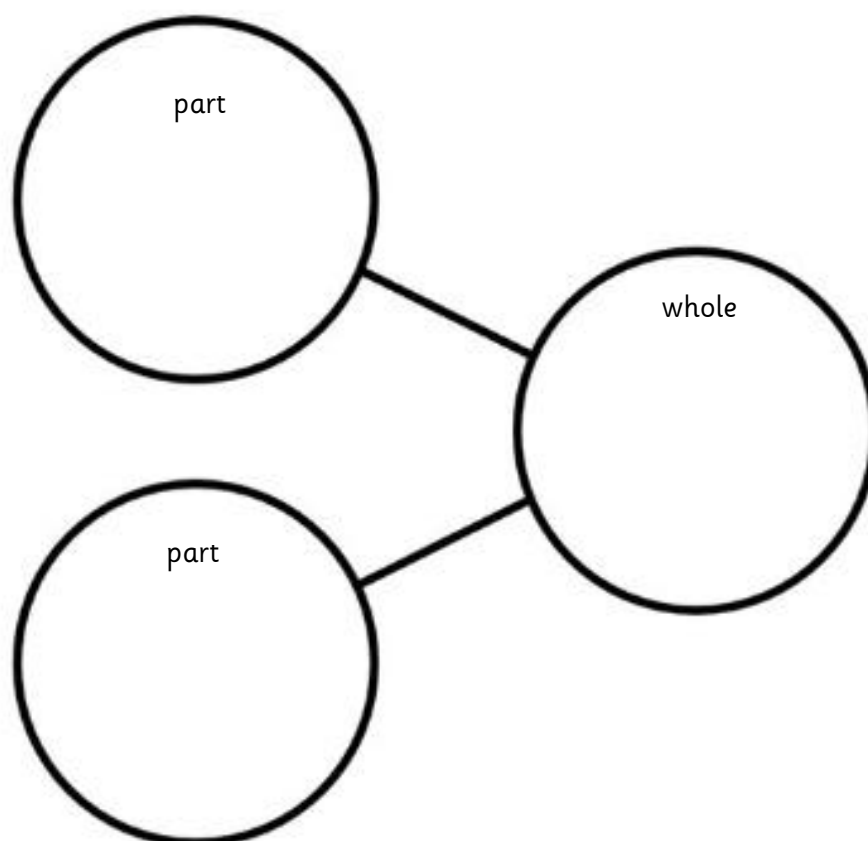

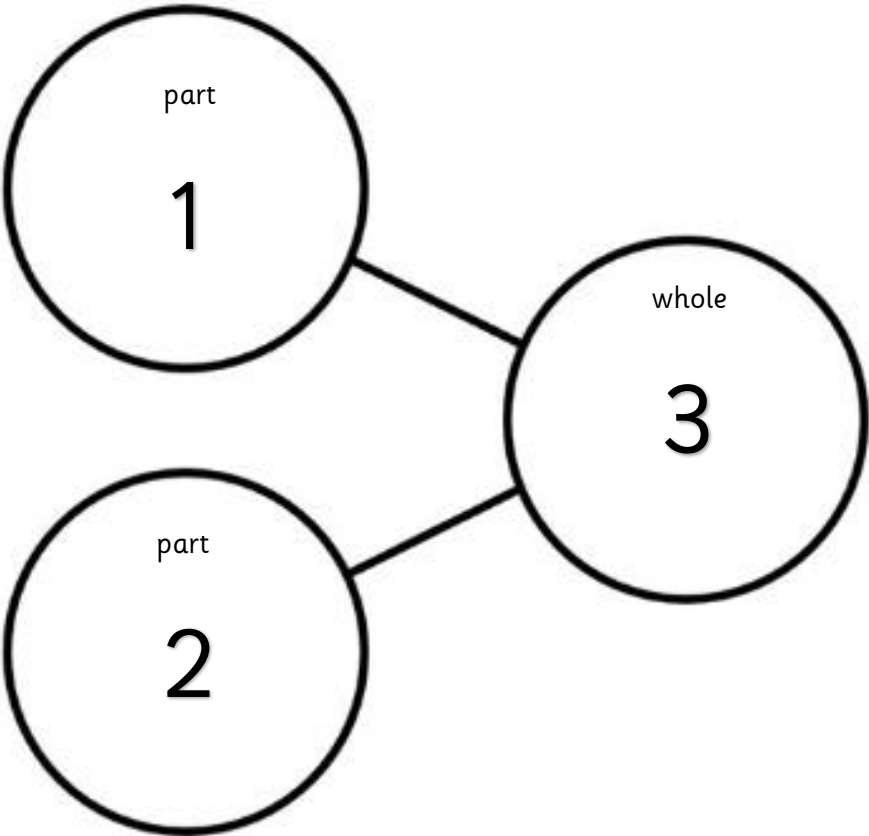
Tens Frame – can you colour in 3 on the tens frame or put 3 objects in to fill the 3 parts of the tens frame?

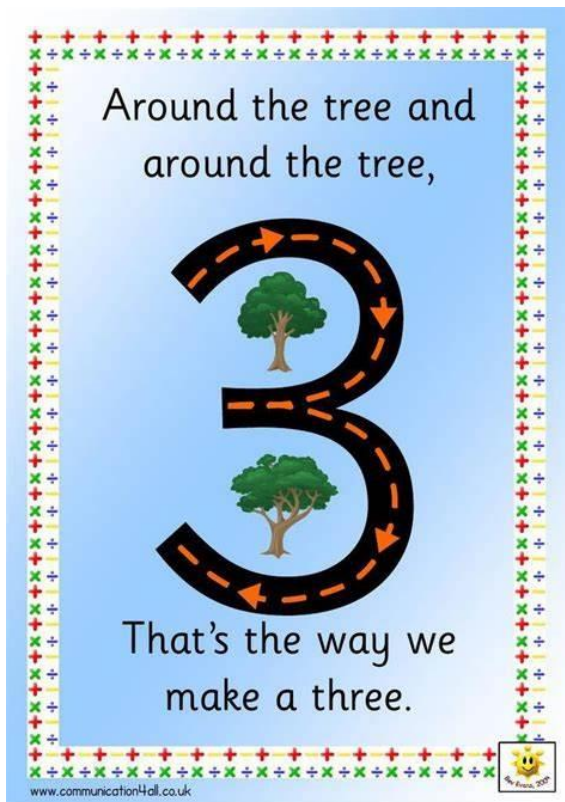

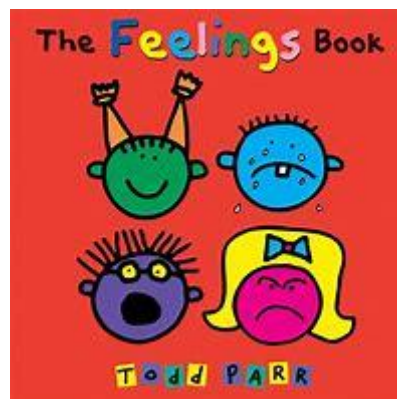

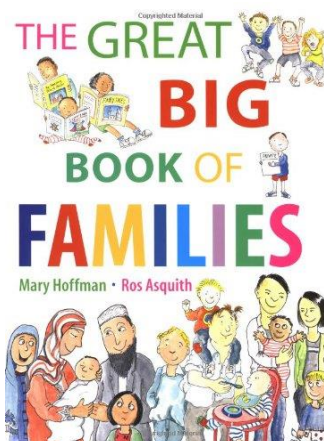
