





This week the children will be making their own sensory shaker based on the work we have been doing on the 5 senses.




This week the children have been learning about how to stay safe online.




#### PDW-

The children have been learning about how to keep themselves and their bodies safe. We have used the video about the Pantasaurus to help them understand what should stay private.


