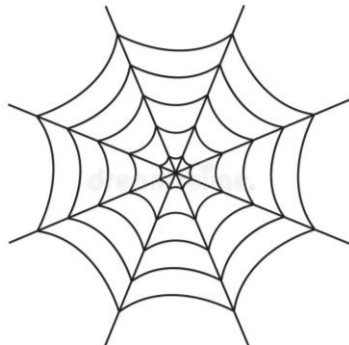
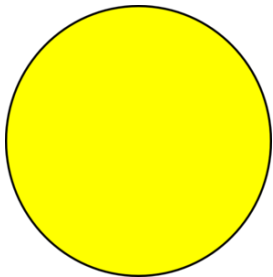

Use the flashcards below to practise recognising these phonemes.

	Pronunciation phrase	Initial/end sounds: What's in the box?
z zebra 	Show me your teeth and buzz the z sound zzzzzz	zebra zip zoo buzz (a bee) fizz (fizzy water)
qu queen 	Pucker your mouth, then open it as you say qu qu qu	queen quack (duck) quick (action)
ch cherries 	Pucker your lips and show your teeth; use your tongue as you say ch ch ch	No more initial sound games

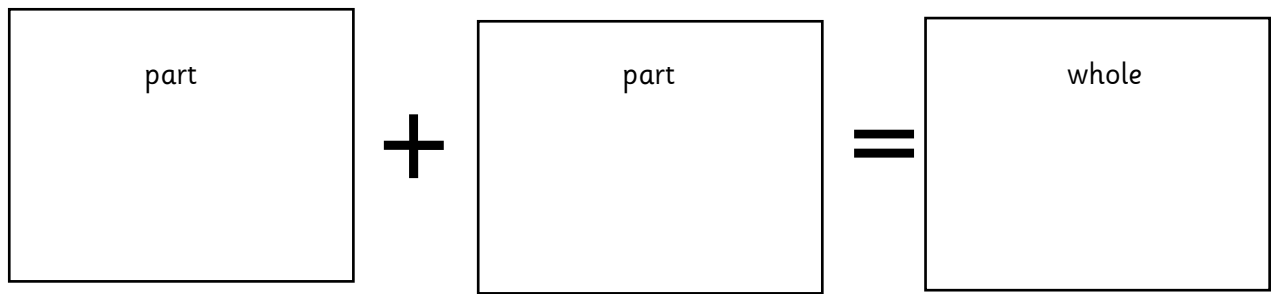

Put your hands upon your knee.





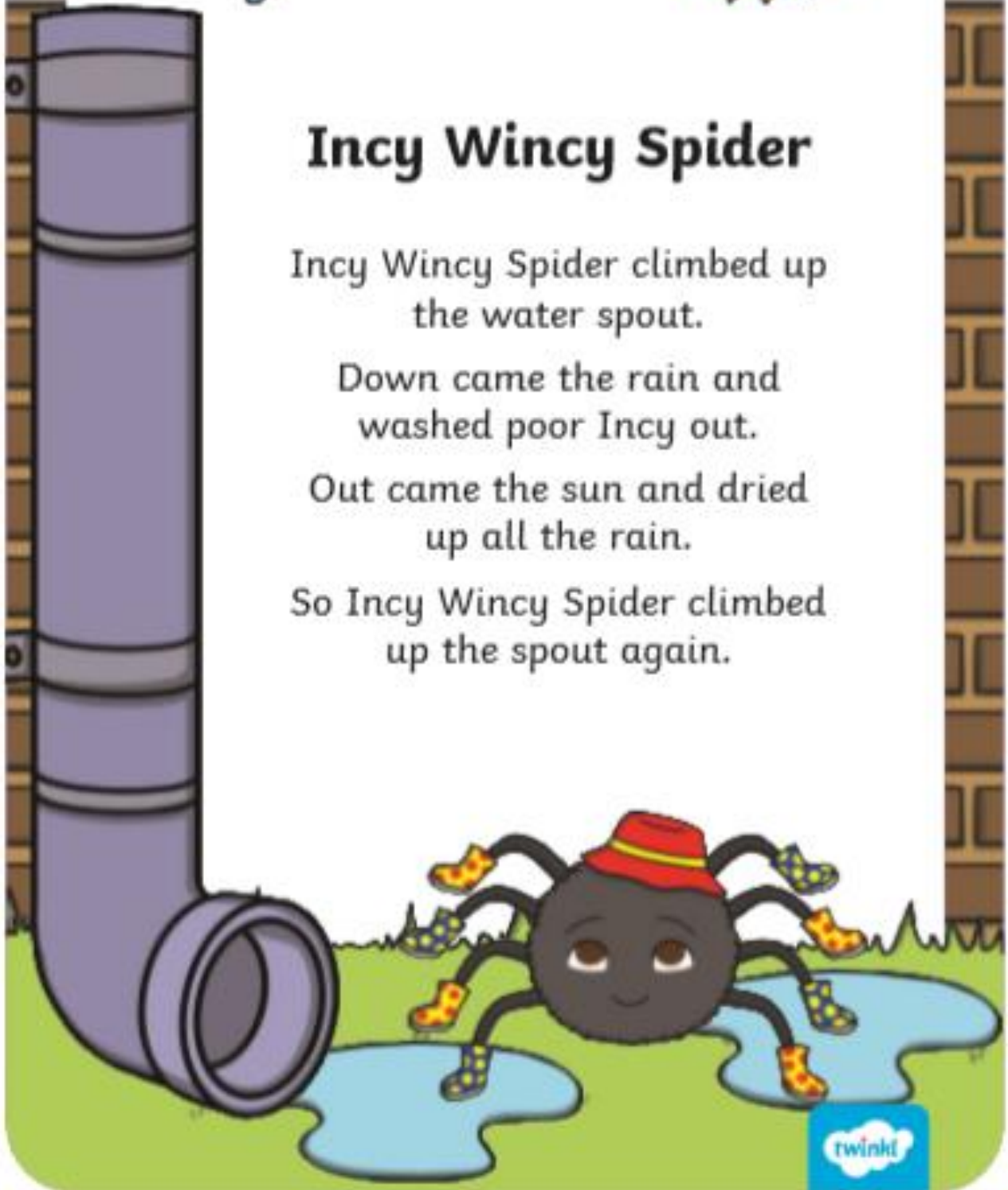
Incy Wincy Spider
