






Christmas Number Bonds to 10

History – The Wright brothers – Can you make your own paper aeroplane and test how far it can go?



The Wright brothers




Orville and Wilbur Wright had to experiment with lots of different aeroplane designs before they were successful in making one fly.


During their experiments they had to do lots of research. What did they know about things that flew well? Birds had two wings and were light, their toy helicopter used spinning propellors to push the air away quickly and make it go up.


They had to do lots of experiments and had lots of failed attempts. Many of their early aeroplane designs crashed! But they didn't give up. They kept revising their design until eventually one flew.

Their first flying aeroplane was a success but they still didn't stop there. They wanted to make their aeroplane fly further and further each time.





STEP 1: Turn your paper so the printed side is facing down. Fold the paper in half, crease the edge, and unfold.






STEP 2: Fold the two upper corners down at a 45-degree angle. Make sure the edges line up with the center crease.







STEP 3: Fold each side again. Make sure the edges line up with the center crease.

STEP 4: Fold the paper in half along the center crease.











STEP 5: Fold the wing along the line shown. Repeat on the other side.










STEP 6: Fold the wing fin along the line shown. Repeat on

the other side. Open the wings and fly!





Geography


Use your knowledge of North, South, East and West to describe the location of places on the Jolly Postman's map.
