## BIRMINGHAM CHILDREN'S PARTNERSHIP SURVEY

Birmingham Children's Partnership, including Birmingham City Council, Birmingham Children's Trust, the NHS, the Police, and local community groups, have drafted a plan called **Change for Children and Young People 2023-2028**. The plan aims to make **Birmingham a great place to grow up**. Of those surveyed to day

- **83%** said they would like Birmingham to be made safer and
- **69%** said they would like to reduce poverty in the city.
